






The Local Government Smart Cities Network (LGSCN) is the most active network of local government smart cities representatives in the region. With more than 70 cities and towns now members, this group of policy makers and practitioners is actively sharing knowledge, building capacity and networking.







The Smart Cities Council launched the Centre for Data Leadership after more than three years of listening and learning about the role of data in generating insights for cities, and how this can accelerate greater liveability, workability and sustainability in our communities.

From 2020 we are dedicating more resources to extend our existing work into the field of data leadership.





Smart Cities ACTIVATUR

The Smart Cities Activator is a real time online collaborative platform for enhancing liveability, workability and sustainability outcomes in cities and towns through best practice scoping, design and financing tools and knowledge resources.

In addition to Activator's project planning resources, it has a global project register (called Activator Exchange) of smart cities projects generated by cities. This allows cities to connect with their peers and share, network and potentially partner.







Smart Cities Week is the premier gathering of smart cities leaders, who come together to network, exchange and create opportunities for accelerating the region's sustainability through technology and data solutions. It is also the platform for rewarding leadership through the Australian Smart Cities Awards.

Every year the SCW program is designed from the ground up as a dialogue-based event. This style of event yields greater networking, intelligence gathering and participation among delegates when compared to traditional smart cities events in the market.
